## 2. Hazards Identification

**Emergency overview** FLAMMABLE  
CONTENTS UNDER PRESSURE. Aerosol. Will be easily ignited by heat, spark or flames.  
Harmful in contact with eyes. Prolonged exposure may cause chronic effects.

**Potential health effects**

**Eyes** Contact may irritate or burn eyes.

**Skin** Prolonged or repeated contact can result in defatting and drying of the skin which may result in skin irritation and dermatitis (rash).

**Inhalation** Intentional misuse by concentrating and inhaling the product can be harmful or fatal. Prolonged inhalation may be harmful.

**Ingestion** Exposure by ingestion of an aerosol is unlikely. Ingestion may cause gastrointestinal irritation, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. May cause delayed lung damage.

**Target organs** Blood. Central nervous system. Gastrointestinal tract. Liver. Respiratory system.

**Chronic effects** Unconsciousness. Conjunctiva. Liver injury may occur. May cause central nervous system disorder (e.g., narcosis involving a loss of coordination, weakness, fatigue, mental confusion, and blurred vision) and/or damage. May cause delayed lung damage. Can cause adverse reproductive effects.

## 4. First Aid Measures

**First aid procedures**

**Eye contact** Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Get medical attention immediately.

**Skin contact** Immediately take off all contaminated clothing. Wash off with warm water and soap. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

**Inhalation** Move to fresh air. Call a physician if symptoms develop or persist.

**Ingestion** Rinse mouth. Get medical attention immediately. Do not induce vomiting without medical advice. If vomiting occurs naturally, have victim lean forward to reduce risk of aspiration. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim ingested the substance. Induce artificial respiration with the aid of a pocket mask equipped with a one-way valve or other proper respiratory medical device.

## 5. Fire Fighting Measures

<b>Flammable properties</b>	Vapor or gas may spread to distant ignition sources and flash back.
<b>Extinguishing media</b>	
<b>Suitable extinguishing media</b>	Foam. Dry chemical. Carbon dioxide (CO <sub>2</sub> ).
<b>Protection of firefighters</b>	
<b>Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters</b>	In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Wear full protective clothing, including helmet, self-contained positive pressure or pressure demand breathing apparatus, protective clothing and face mask. Containers should be cooled with water to prevent vapor pressure build up. For massive fire, use unmanned hose holders or monitor nozzles; if this is impossible, withdraw from area and let fire burn.

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

<b>Methods for containment</b>	Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Move the cylinder to a safe and open area if the leak is irreparable.
<b>Methods for cleaning up</b>	Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean contaminated surface thoroughly.

## 7. Handling and Storage

<b>Handling</b>	Pressurized container: Do not pierce or burn, even after use. Do not handle or store near an open flame, heat or other sources of ignition. Do not use if spray button is missing or defective. Use only with adequate ventilation. Do not get this material in contact with eyes. Do not get this material in contact with skin. Avoid prolonged exposure.
<b>Storage</b>	Level 2 Aerosol. Contents under pressure. Do not puncture, incinerate or crush. The pressure in sealed containers can increase under the influence of heat. Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame. Avoid exposure to long periods of sunlight. Store in cool place. Keep in an area equipped with sprinklers. Keep out of the reach of children.
